

## **Snowballs & Nine Patch**

### Supply List

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For this quilt, the snowball blocks begin with 6 ½” squares of light fabric. Rectangles in the inner border are 6 ½” x 2 ½”, also lights. All other squares, both light and dark, are 2 ½” x 2 ½”. Scraps work wonderfully for this, and you don’t need very large pieces. However, it does help to cut 2 ½” strips of many fabrics and then cut the strips into 2 ½” squares. Because I didn’t start out with yardage, I can’t tell you how much fabric you’ll need. Just bring “stuff from your stash.”

Sewing machine with ¼” foot and straight stitch or zigzag foot

Rotary mat, cutter and rulers

Thread to blend with fabrics

Marker (pencil or chalk) for marking dark squares

Basic sewing supplies

Flannel covered cardboard, 15” – 18” square. I used this to lay out my piles of 2 ½” squares so I could easily choose them while making both snowball and 9 patch blocks.
